ODD GROWTH: from (H) to (K) YB 30", YB 24", BC 22", B 18", BC 24", SUBS to 18" + stunted, at most 40', damaged crowns, twisted boles. See also page (5)

MYSTERY SPOT (J): On a ±15° to 20° slope below the summit ledges, a channel leads downhill & ends in a boulder ±10 ft long. The channel is about 2 ft deep & suggests that the boulder slid down, but the slope is not steep; cold ice, snow or water have served as a lubricant? Several SUBs were knocked over with till fresh "pancakes", but the pancakes are as much as 10 ft. from the hollows as if the trees flew through the air. The top of one SUB trunk is under the boulder. Tomado? (no other trees touched). Lightning? (no scarring or burning). The ground is disturbed in places with boulders moved. A skidder, perhaps, but its route ends abruptly without connections to downslope.

NE Richmond Summit, elev. 3220  
(G): Canopy to 40', BC dom, some SUG.

COL between NE Richmond & Richmond between (G) & (H): Crest very narrow, dense CHC, trail crosses crest from S side to N side. Panax tri

VV flat: one ledge down from mystery spot (J)

SUB dom, with CAULO, ALLIUM, PETI. 1°. SUB to 18". HYDRO, Ery, Clayf.

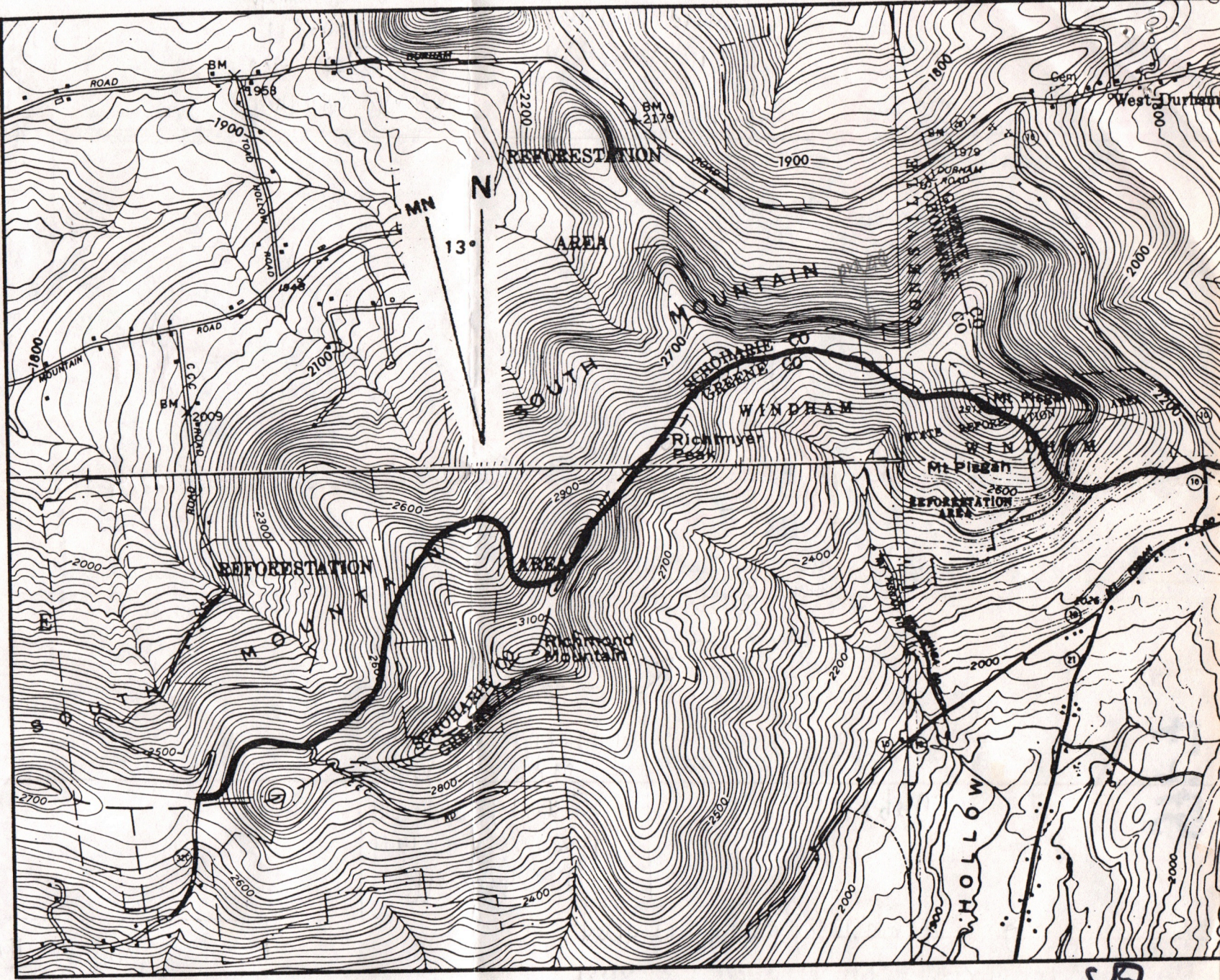
West end of high ledge has both CARP + OST at crest, elev. ±3100'.

Tree #98 → One Jug broken off, 105 years in after 8 1/2" radius of a 10" radius (20" DBH) tree. Other SUBs to 22" & 28". BC diam with a 30" pancake indicating deeper till, also jumped far from hollow: another mystery spot.
