Griffin p40: Mill at the falls had David P. Mager with a controlling interest.

-1928 - Ira Hicks' daughter sells to Nan White's father,

Non-forest product mill = Fulling mill for 3 run by water power from the falls.

1869 Beers' Map shows Ira Hicks as owner with a bldg. unidentified. Could be the foundation today

Samuel Stratton owned land, possibly built the Lower mill

Ira Hicks had a store there in 1869 (Beers').  
Coopers & blacksmith shops. Jan 1869  
Gold Map  
Griffin p40

1859 Sold to Ira Hicks

Sawmill mentioned in Griffin p-36  
No detail on owner.

1856 Jay Gould's Map: "B. G. Morse Saw mill" Only the upper mill shown.

Only the Lower Sawmill is shown on Beers 1869 map.

Mk thought the 2 Sawmills were one & the same, # 107 (p. 166, 2000) shown on Gould's & Beers' maps.

Sale 1844 - Abraham's son (Jay's father) to Burton John Burr Gould. Morse

A. Gould was one of 5 1st settlers in W. Settlement

Munsell (1920) says: Nothing about Stratton Falls area or W Settlement or Mill

Later reassigned to Abraham Gould, Jay's grandfather. Whipple area betw 1820 & 1830.

Lot 52 on 1983 DEC Catmill Land Map is further west, betw W Settlement Upper

Whipple prob built the mill (Griffin, p-36)

Ira Hicks is on Lot 130 Lot 52 ~~is not~~ on Beers' Map. is not numbered

Jan 1, 1805: James Derbrosses leased the land to Luther Whipple. [1795 Griffin p36 leased Lot 52 by Whipple] ??
