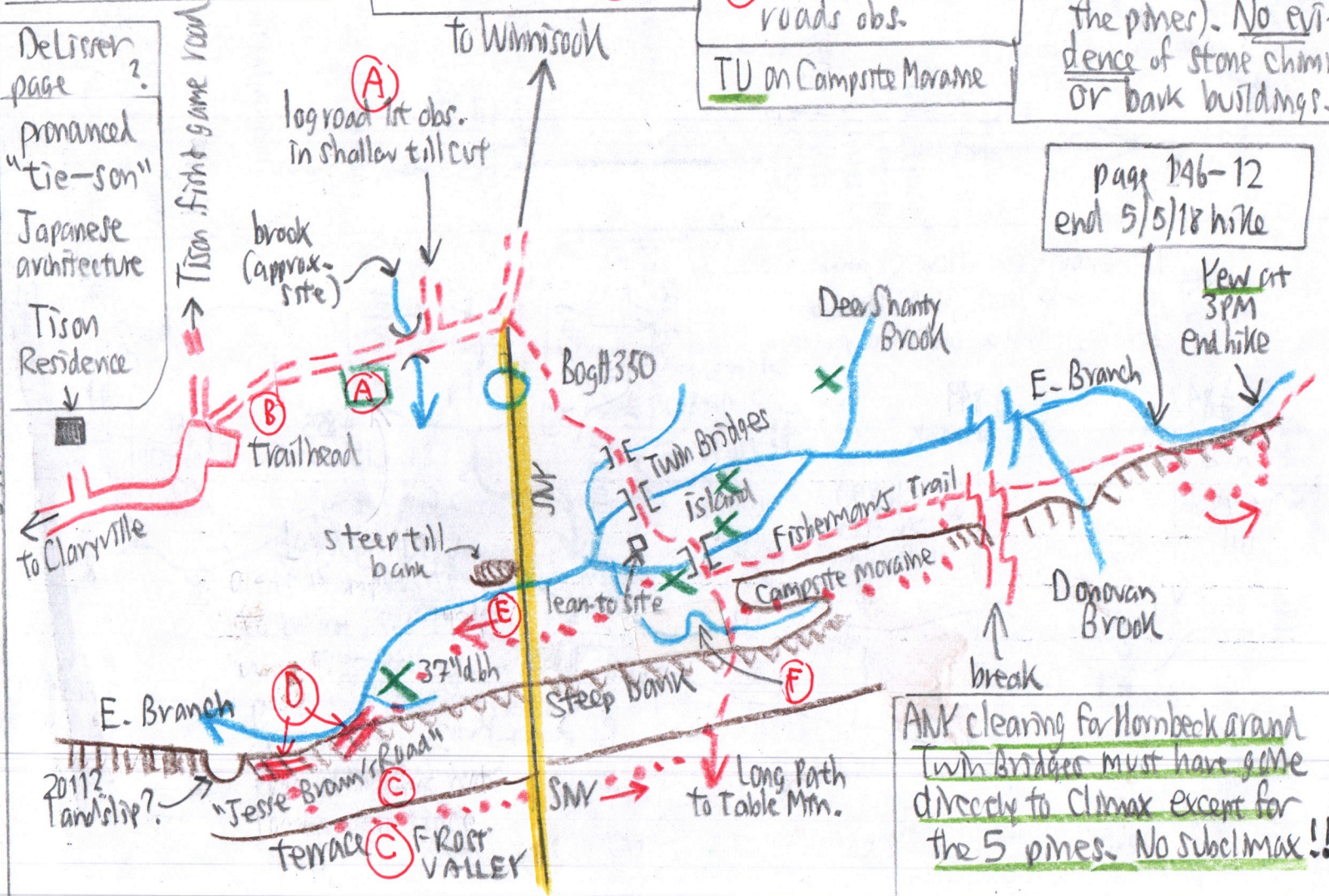
(A) Log deck open area & stumps date to before 1978-1979 when Frost Valley purchased portions of Tison lands. Frost Valley has not logged here since.
Stumps also at (C) date to late 1970s

X = e-white pines
(B) Old road to S side Junction not obs. Vis side intermittently at (D)
Scott. first seedlings from twin bridges downstream to (D) & up.

(E) Lunch spot under hemlocks. Nearby 32" YB
(F) Rill meander on flat flood plain. Old RMs to 24" ± Few SUBS in region.
(C) No recent skid roads obs.
TU on Campsite Moraine

Conclusion: "Jesse Brown" (discoverer) Road is intermittent by washouts, descending to flood plain at (D) and then lost. Must have served J.C. Hornbeck who must have lived around Twin Bridges (hence the pines). No evidence of stone chimney or bark buildings.
